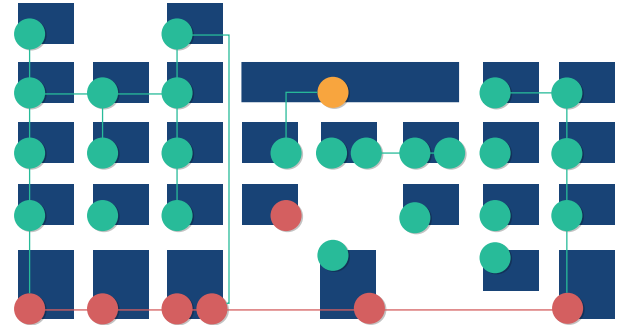

iServer is delivered with core models and examples explaining IT4IT concepts.



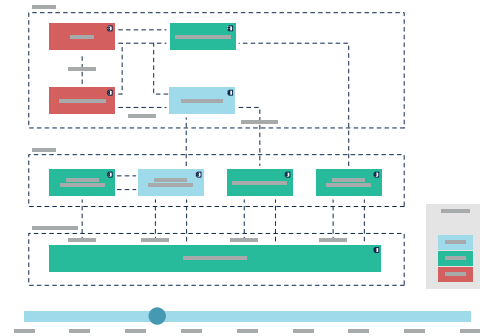
Preconfigured IT4IT Repository

The iServer repository comes prepopulated with predefined Visio templates and stencils.



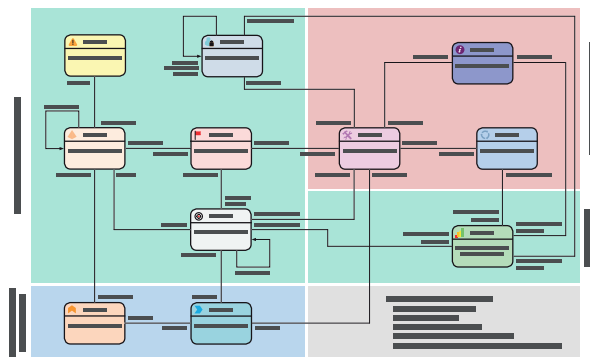
Complete IT4IT Value Chain
