Which country are you purchasing in?	The offer must be available and published in your specific geographical region.	Confirm Azure Marketplace availability in your location.	<a href="#">Geographic availability and currency support.</a>
What legal terms are being used in the deal?	All deals must comply with Azure Marketplace listing policies.	Your deal will be structured under the Standard Contract for Marketplace or include Custom T&Cs as agreed.	<a href="#">Standard Contract &amp; Amendments.</a>
What is the Total Contract Value?	Pricing depends on your chosen solution, number of licences or “seats” required, and any add-ons selected.	Final contract value will be determined during negotiation with Orbus Software. Contact your sales rep for details.	Speak to your Orbus Software representative.
What is the length of contract?	Contract length – 1, 2, or 3 years – can impact pricing. Multi-year deals (especially 3 years) may unlock savings.	Your preferred term will be confirmed during negotiations and included in your final offer.	Speak to your Orbus Software representative.
What is the start date of contract?	Impacts billing cycle and activation timeline.	Start date is typically the date of acceptance but can be agreed during offer setup.	<a href="#">Review “Offer Set-up”.</a>

What is the timeline for acceptance of a private offer?	All private offers are time-bound, similar to invoices, and must be accepted within the stated validity period. Do you have a Marketplace billing profile set up?	A valid billing profile is required to complete purchases via the Azure Marketplace.	Confirmation that your Marketplace billing profile is active and correct.	<a href="#">Billing profile review</a>
Are you allowed to purchase via Azure Policy?	Azure Policies may restrict Marketplace purchases.	Check policy settings and permissions.	<a href="#">Check policy assignment for Azure Portal</a>

# Helpful Orbus Resources

## Terms Glossary

Marketplace Transactions		Technical & Portal Terms	
Azure Marketplace	Microsoft's digital storefront where organizations can purchase cloud-based software like OrbusInfinity.	Subscription ID	A unique identifier for your Azure subscription, used to allocate and manage resources.
Private offer	A customized, invite-only offer created by Orbus for a specific customer. It includes agreed pricing, terms, and contract length.	Resource group	A logical container in Azure where related services and resources are managed together.
Private plan	A restricted version of a standard Marketplace plan, visible only to specified customers.	Purchase controls	Policies in your Azure setup that govern who can buy from the Marketplace. These may need to be adjusted for private offers.
Public offer	A Marketplace listing available to all customers at published prices and terms.	Private Marketplace	An internal Marketplace curated by your organization, allowing only approved solutions like OrbusInfinity.
Offer type	The product category listed on Marketplace – for OrbusInfinity, this is typically "SaaS".	Role assignments	Defines who in your Azure environment has permissions to accept private offers or make purchases.

## Financial & Strategic Terms

### MACC (Microsoft Azure Consumption Commitment)

A pre-agreed spend commitment with Microsoft. Purchases of OrbusInfinity through Marketplace count 100% towards MACC drawdown.

### TCV (Total Contract Value)

The total value of a contract over its full term, including all applicable software and services.

### Customer billing currency

The currency your organization is charged in, as set in your Azure billing profile. This may differ from your local currency.

### Marketplace country currency

The currency associated with your Azure Marketplace purchasing location.

## Billing and Agreements

### Billing ID

A unique identifier for your Azure billing account or invoice. Required when setting up a private offer.

### Billing term

The frequency of billing for your Marketplace purchase – e.g., monthly, annually, or multi-year.

### EA (Enterprise Agreement)

A Microsoft volume licensing agreement for larger organizations, typically over a three-year term.

### MCA (Microsoft Customer Agreement)

A simplified contract model used by many mid-size organizations for Microsoft cloud services. Includes purchasing through Azure Marketplace.

**Understanding MACC** When you purchase OrbusInfinity through the Azure Marketplace, your organization can benefit from **MACC drawdown**.

- 100% of the software purchase value contributes toward your MACC obligation –not just the associated cloud infrastructure cost. This maximizes the value of your pre-committed spend. Learn more – Azure consumption commitment benefit.
- MACC decrement occurs at the time of invoicing. For example, if your total contract is valued at \$12,000 annually and billed monthly, your MACC balance will reduce by \$1,000 per month, aligning with your Azure invoice cycle.

## Understanding private offers vs private plans in Azure Marketplace

As an Orbus Software customer, it's important to understand the difference between private offers and private plans when transacting via the Azure Marketplace:

- Private offers (as outlined throughout this guide) provide customized pricing or discounts on existing public plans. These are not listed publicly in the Azure Marketplace gallery but are offered directly to you via a private link. The agreed discount is applied at the billing account level in your Azure subscription.
- Private plans, by contrast, are entirely custom-built plans tailored for a specific customer. These plans are also not visible in the public Marketplace gallery and are only accessible to the customer for whom they're designed.

## Bundling multiple solutions in a single private offer

Orbus can include multiple plans from various public offers within a single private offer, allowing for a bundled solution. This makes acceptance and procurement seamless, as it requires just one acceptance process for all included plans.

*Note: All plans included must be publicly available and transactable in Azure Marketplace.*

## Can I transact services through Azure Marketplace?

Yes – while fully service-based solutions are not yet supported, Microsoft now allows Professional Services Offers to be listed and bundled with software as part of a private offer. [Learn more](#)

*Note: Professional Services Offers are currently only available to customers in the UK, US, and Canada.*

## Accepting a private offer

Accepting a private offer signifies that the customer agrees to the pricing and terms specified within the offer, forming a contractual agreement between the customer, the publisher (Orbus Software), and Microsoft.

**There are two ways to accept a private offer:**

- **Option 1: Via email link**  
Click the private offer link sent directly to your inbox.
- **Option 2: Through Azure Portal**  
Navigate to **Azure Portal > Marketplace > Private Offer Management** to view and accept the offer.

### Important:

Once accepted, an additional action is required – **the customer must complete the purchase or subscription** to activate the offer.
